



# Behaviour Policy Update

We have updated our behaviour policy to enhance the school experiences of Springfield pupils. The full behaviour policy is available on our website, but the key information can be found below.

Thank you to all the pupils and staff who helped to develop our new policy.

Every classroom has a behaviour board like the picture below and every pupil has a peg with their name and house colour on it, which can be moved up or down the board accordingly.

Each day is a new day, so all names move back to green in the morning.



**Gold:** children are moved to gold when they demonstrate exemplary behaviour. They are awarded 10 house points and if they move to gold 5 times in a half term, you will receive a special letter from Mrs Pick or Miss Denyer celebrating your child's hard work.

**Green:** children start the day here. We expect children to be ready to learn and allow others to learn. They should be focussed, listening, take pride in all that they do and be respectful to all. When your child remains on green for an entire half term, they will be awarded a Green Card to celebrate their efforts.

**Yellow:** after an initial verbal warning, your child's name will be moved to yellow if they are not meeting the green expectations for behaviour. They will spend part of their break time reflecting on their behaviour. If this happens 5 times within a half term, the teacher will ask to meet with parents. KS1 5mins / KS2 10mins

**Red:** if behaviour does not improve or a more serious incident occurs, your child may be moved to red to indicate that they are not meeting our behaviour expectations. This will result in the child spending part of their lunchtime in the Retreat and Reflect Room (R&R). They will be supported to reflect on their behaviours and talk through the difficulties they are having in order to choose the next steps to being the best they can be. If this happens 3 times within a half term, a member of the senior leadership team will contact the parents. KS1 15mins / KS2 30mins

## House Points

Children will continue to earn points for their houses, but now these points will also go towards their own total as they work towards achieving personal awards.

Bronze 50 house points

Silver 125 house points

Gold 250 house points



We want to recognise and celebrate our pupil's efforts in school, so when they achieve the threshold of house points they will be given their award in our achievement assembly and be added to our House Point Award Hall of Fame display.

The Gold Book is officially open for 2019!

When your child does something amazing, their teacher may send them to have their name entered into the Gold Book. They will receive a shiny gold sticker and be celebrated in our Achievement Assembly.
