

Managing Behaviour at Springfield



Our new behaviour policy has been finalised and changes have been made to ensure it is in line with TPP (Trauma Perception Practice) and prioritises the wellbeing of our pupils. A full version of the new behaviour and wellbeing policy is available on our website but the key information can be found below.

Each classroom has a behaviour board like the picture below and every pupil has a peg with their name and house colour on it, which can be moved up or down the board accordingly.

All names start the day on green ©

Let's celebrate!



Green - All names start here and remain here when they demonstrate the expected behaviour outlined in our school rules which is to be ready, be respectful and be safe.

Let's Celebrate - A child's name can move up to 'Let's Celebrate!' when they show exemplary behaviour, academic achievement or it could be for achieving an individual goal that is unique to the child. A 'Let's Celebrate' certificate is completed, outlining what is being celebrated and then the child visits Mrs Pick or Mrs Esser to share their achievement and be written in the Celebration Book.

If a child deviates from the school rules of 'Be ready, Be respectful, Be safe' then a verbal reminder is given.

- If the behaviour persists after a verbal reminder then a yellow reflection card is discreetly issued.
- A reflection card gives the child the opportunity/time to think and make changes to their behaviour.
- If the child rectifies their behaviour then the card is removed.
- If the behaviour continues then a reflective conversation will be had at play time to support the child make changes.

If the behaviour does not improve or a more serious incident occurs, the child will be referred to the Reflection Room. This will result in the child spending part of their lunchtime with a duty teacher where they will be supported to reflect on their behaviour and talk through the difficulties they are having in order to choose the next steps to being the best they can be.

House Points

Children earn house points in the form of tokens that count towards the overall house point total for their house.

The house point tokens from each class are collected weekly and added to the whole school collection container which is then counted and an overall house winner will be crowned at the end of the year. As well as earning house points for demonstrating our core values, children will be awarded house points for the various house competitions throughout the year, including The Great Springfield Bake Off, Spelling Bee and other sporting competitions.

Celebration Book

When a child does something amazing, their teacher may send them to have their name entered into the Celebration Book. They will receive a shiny gold sticker, a certificate and be celebrated in our weekly Celebration Assembly.
